

Sport Funding Spring 2019

Funding for 2018 to 2019

- Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil.
- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive **£16,000** and an additional payment of **£10** per pupil.

Queen's Drive received a total budget of approximately £20,000 for pupils from Y1-Y6. Funding is based on data from the school census.

At the time of producing this report, there was £1500 in the Sport Funding allocation with the next payment due in April 2019. Below is a table of how this money has been/will be spent.

The current SPRING provision is as follows:

Although the sports premium funding is not calculated with EYFS children in the numbers, we feel as a school that the importance of skill development as early as possible should be catered for.

As previously mentioned, the government highlight that the purpose of the funding is to ensure that schools make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and Sport they offer. We feel that Queen’s Drive fully meet this criteria with its commitment to CPD opportunities for staff and additional sporting opportunities for children. We currently have 5 different sports clubs that take place on a weekly basis.

This means that we will continue to use the premium to:

- *develop or add to the PE and Sport activities that your school already offers*
- *make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years*

Competitions

The school is very proactive in terms of intra and inter-school sporting competitions. In terms of external sporting competitions, the school has recently taken part in the Preston Schools’ Tag Rugby Festival, finishing a superb 3rd place overall. The Year 3/4 multi skills team won their athletics event recently and the Year 5/6 girls football team finished 3rd in the Preston Schools’ Girls football competition.

The Boys football team sit mid-table in their league whilst the girl’s team are top of their league with one game to play! The girl’s team are also through to the semi-finals of the Dick Kerr Ladies football competition. The boys were knocked out at the quarter final stage.

60 children from Year 4 recently participated in a Tri-School Sports festival held at Ashton High School. St Andrews and Sherwood were the other two schools. Queen’s Drive won 6 of the ten team competitions!

Queen’s Drive currently sit in 4th place, only 27 points behind leaders Our Lady & St Edwards in the Preston Schools’ Sports Championship. 60 schools take part in this event. (See next page for the top 22 places)

Impact on Sporting provision at Queen's Drive Primary School

Continued support from the Sports Premium funding will enable the school to carry on accessing additional specialist services which will allow us to reach an even wider range of pupils. The impact on staff CPD and pupil skill development will continue to be significant and all future support specifically targeted to do so. The range of competitions are aimed at pupils aged from as young as 5 years old through to 11 years of age. We have highlighted Girls in Sport, KS1 pupil team participation and the development of fundamental skills. Although a staff audit, completed in September 2018, highlighted particular lack of skill/sport specific knowledge and some delivery confidence across the key stages, we feel that more focus on team teaching, subject leader support alongside targeted specialist coach input will have a greater impact this academic year. In particular, gymnastics and dance will become a focus for team teaching using the existing expertise already in school. In the same audit, netball skills came out as a strength amongst teachers. This is pleasing to see as some year groups have received CPD in this area in recent years.

The school has once more been awarded the 'Gold' standard from the School Games organisation. This is proof that a high proportion of our children attend clubs on a regular basis and have opportunities to represent their school at a range of levels and sports. This is the 3rd year running that Queen's Drive have achieved this award. Only 5 other schools have it in Preston at the moment.

The school has submitted a nomination to the Preston Sports Award committee for 'Primary School of the Year' and also for 'Junior team of the year' – Gymnastics. The shortlisted schools will be notified in a few weeks time before the awards on the 22nd of March 2019.

Resources

Additional resources to support the delivery of the curriculum have been purchased from the PE curriculum capitation and the Sport Funding stream. The school is well resourced on the whole but due to the size of the school, it is necessary to constantly replenish equipment that gets worn out and lost.
