PE

PE will take place twice a week:

- Class 13 Wednesday, Friday
- Class 14 Wednesday, Thursday
- Children need an indoor PE kit and an outdoor PE kit with trainers and optional tracksuit (navy blue bottoms/top). These are kept in school.
- Please ensure ALL kit, including shoes, is clearly labelled!!
- All jewellery must be removed.



Homework

- Homework in Y6 will take a variety of forms:
 - Each week we set a spelling rule. Some children may receive spelling lists. We sometimes use spelling shed to support this.
- We use MyMaths for Maths and Seesaw for other subjects.
- All pupils will receive a username and password for any online resources we use. This must be kept safe!
- We check when each piece of homework has been completed.
- Your child is expected to read daily for 15 minutes. Their diary should be signed regularly by an adult – this will be monitored. Children will be rewarded for getting their reading books signed with fake money to spend in our class shop.
- As well as reading books, children will bring home a library book, which can be changed weekly during the class library session.

Planners and pens


- Your child's planner should be in school everyday.
- They will be checked for reading at home.
- Children can also record in their own planners when they have read.
- We also encourage children in Y6 to record homework and other useful/important information in preparation for high school.
- Year 6 are all expected to write in pen, pupils may wish to use a preferred pen from home.

Feedback on attainment

• Your child will be assessed and judgements made as to whether they are working at expected standard, working towards the expected standard or working below the expected standard.

SATs

- Week commencing Monday 13th May Thursday 16th May.
- Tests in Reading, Maths, SPaG.
- Children will be given a raw score which is then turned into a standardised score.
- A score of 100 will equate to an average ability child in Y6. 110 indicates children working above expected and 99 or less those working below the expected standard.
- Teacher assessment in Writing.
- Science sampling to be confirmed.



High school

- Deadline for high school applications- 31st October. Applications are online.

- Please ensure that you visit any of the high schools and look at their admission criteria before applying.
- If you do not apply for your place or receive any of your 3 choices, then the local authority choose the school for you.

High school Transition

- Transition work will be completed after SATs and high schools will want to visit the children and gain information from the teacher.
- All high schools offer a move up day – dates tbc.

Online Safety

- Online safety is important as children's access to the internet and social media increases. Websites like the NSPCC have great ideas and support to protect young children.

Relationships and Sex education

- In the spring term, year 6 will invite you in to see the lessons we teach regarding RSE.
- In 2018 the government passed an amendment to the Children and Social Work Bill to make RSE and Health Education statutory from Sept 2020.
- 'Schools must not unlawfully discriminate against pupils because of their age, sex, race, disability, religion or belief, gender reassignment...or sexual orientation (protected characteristics)
- 'Schools should be alert to issues such as everyday sexism, misogyny, homophobia and gender stereotypes and take positive action to build a culture where these are not tolerated'
- 'Head teachers will automatically grant a request to withdraw a pupil from any **sex education** delivered in primary schools, other than as part of the science curriculum.'
- There is no right to withdraw from Relationships Education or Health Education.
