Key Vocabulary

Blurb – On the back cover of a book, there is usually a summary of the story, this is called the blurb. The blurb tells you a little bit about the story to make you excited to read the book.

Author – this is the person who has written a story.

Illustrator – this is the person who has drawn the pictures in a story.

Fiction – A fiction book is made up. The writer has used their imagination to create a story which didn't really happen in real life. Fiction books are written to be exciting and entertain their reader.

Non-fiction - A non-fiction book is one which tells you facts and information about the world around you. If it is about something that really happened or something that really exists, it is non-fiction.

Nocturnal animals – Animals that hunt or are generally active after dark have special adaptations that make it easier to live during the night.

Seasons - each of the four divisions of the year (spring, summer, autumn, and winter) marked by particular weather patterns and daylight hours, resulting from the earth's changing position with regard to the sun.
